Dear saints,

When I drive the carpool for high school band, I charge a “fare” for each of the kids I take home. The “fare” is their answer to a simple yet important inquiry: “Tell me something good.” It doesn’t have to be a big thing - it can be as simple as something good they ate for lunch, or getting to spend time with a friend, or looking forward to sleeping in. This offers two purposes for me: it helps me get to know each of the kids better, and it helps them find some good news in their lives worth sharing.

Sometimes it can be hard to find good news amidst the chaos and brokenness of the world. Yet that’s exactly our call as Christians. Lent was originally a season for new converts to study what was central to Christianity. So we will spend this Lent on something good, stories that are central to Jesus’ life and ministry: radical welcome, love for neighbor, care for the vulnerable, nourishment for the hungry, and nonviolence in the face of injustice. We will spend time with the Good News of God: liberation, love, mercy, and grace.

Rooted in the good news, then, we will face our challenge: in the words of *A Sanctified Art*, “can we be “good news” people in a world too often burdened by bad news?” This Lent, let us remember that the good news really is good news. Let us make room for the spiritual disciplines that make room for this good news: worshipping, learning, giving, and connecting. Let connect through Just Desserts and Second Breakfast. Let us engage our hearts and minds through “The Librarians” and Crucial Conversations. Let us give freely to the Souper Bowl of Caring. This Lent, let the teachings of Jesus lead us forward. May the good news inspire us to take action in a world desperate to hear, see, and taste what is good.

Financial Report as of December 31, 2025



We ended 2025 on a very positive note and will talk more about that and our 2026 budget at our annual meeting on March 1. I hope that we can keep that momentum going into this year. It's hard to believe that as I write this we are already 2 weeks into 2026.

Did you receive your stewardship packet and stay to eat delicious breakfast tacos? Thanks to Harry Staley for organizing the breakfast tacos for our stewardship kick-off. I hope that all of you read Pastor Kate's letter and checked our the narrative budget to see how WPC is faithfully giving back to the community. Not only does WPC help with NEW DAY and Swift Elementary and fills the grocery basket every month for Arlington Charities, as well as a whole host of other local missions, YOU, the people of WPC contributed over \$25,000 to help those in need. You notated on your check or Zelle payment that your extra giving should go to Arlington Charities or NEW DAY or Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services. You also have earmarked your separate funds for specific Presbyterian giving - the Joy Offering, One Great Hour of Sharing, Peace & Global Witness Offering and Pentecost. Some of you earmark your extra giving to go to our Living Waters for the World fund. When you do the extra giving, you will get credit on your giving statement from WPC and we'll send the money where it needs to go.

If you have not yet turned in your pledge card, don't worry! You can still bring them to church in February and put them in the offering plate, mail or bring them to the church office, or email treasurer@wpcarlington.org with your pledge amount. Your pledge cards will help us finalize the budget that will be presented to the congregation at the annual meeting. Small Updates, Big Impact

We had Roadcare, a local small business, repaint the striping in the parking lot, in addition to the white reflective paint to the curbs on the 3 entrances next week. With the help of Jim Johnson, we've had Blackhawk install a new keypad lock on the Main Door and new Fellowship Hall doors with keypad lock and new education wing doors with a door handle that can be unlocked. Jim is still working out the keypad lock programming - watch your emails for more updates on how to get a code! We have had new lights on the pole installed with photocell plus added photocell to FH outside wall light and timers replaced with on/off switch so no more adjusting for time changes.

Don't forget to help us by turning off lights, making sure the heat/air is on schedule, and locking doors when you leave!

Guatemala Water Project Update: Sharing Living Water in Word and Deed

The Water Mission Committee is grateful to share a joyful update on the water purification ministry serving the community of Las Canoas, Guatemala through the Instituto Mixto de Educación Básica por Cooperativa Maya Canoense. This project continues to be a tangible expression of love—offering not only physical aid, but also bearing witness to the power of a shared mission and vision.


Our local partner, Pablo Perez, recently confirmed that the system is operating consistently and effectively, producing clean water for both the school and the surrounding village. The system currently operates three days per week and has processed approximately 1,034 gallons of purified water over the past month and a half.

Even during December, when school was not in session, the local team continued producing clean water so that families in the community would not go without. Since students returned on January 12, 2026, the program has grown further. The school now produces approximately 25 garrafón (5 gallon containers) of purified water each week and is actively promoting the availability of clean water throughout the village, including through community outreach and digital communication. This is above and beyond the production used for in school services for students and staff.

We are encouraged to see this project becoming what we planned it would be: a sustainable, locally led ministry of mercy and dignity, rooted in service and stewardship. Through your prayers and generosity, this community is experiencing both physical blessing and a visible reminder that God sees them, cares for them, and provides for them.

As Westminster's mission reminds us, we are called to share God's love in both word and deed, offering hope, restoration, and the promise of new life. This water project is one small but meaningful way we are living out that calling.



The February Bookworms selection is the Pulitzer Prize-winning novel, *James* by Percival Everett. This re-telling of the Huckleberry Finn story is told from the point of view of the slave known as Jim. In this book Jim (James) is shown to be a self-educated man who is desperately trying to free himself and his family. Using the original story as a base, the book includes new adventures of Jim and incorporates real life individuals such as the man who wrote the song "Dixie." Heartbreaking at times, this story shows the role of prejudice and misinformation that leads to unrealistic beliefs and expectations of others. It is the story of the importance of freedom and the desperation to achieve it.

The March book is *Switchboard Soldiers* by Jennifer Chiaverini. This historical fiction novel is about the women of the U.S. Army Signal Corp during World War I. These women served as telephone operators in France. They broke gender barriers and aided in the Allied victory. It includes real life women and details how they handled the war, military life, and the Spanish flu. The women were hired for a traditional man's role because they proved to be faster and more efficient at connecting calls. The book covers their recruitment, training, and deployment to France as well as their vital work there.



Ulster Project Belfast Closes After 50 Years

Ulster Project Belfast, after 50 years, has made the difficult decision to stop sending Northern Irish teens to the United States. Father John writes, "It is with a heavy heart that we have reached the conclusion that financially the project is becoming out of reach for our target families and consequently we can no longer proceed with the 2026 Project... What has not diminished is the indisputable positive impact and blessings that the Ulster Project has had on our young people and the goodness that has permeated throughout our society. We owe Milwaukee and Arlington – the two stalwarts of the Ulster Project - a debt of gratitude that we will never be able to repay. Your consistent friendship, ever faithful love and prayerful support saw us through bad times. You were ever there for us."

After hearing from Father John, UP Arlington's Board met and made the difficult decision that we would have to end our participation in the Ulster Project. This decision was not made lightly and even though we are certain it is the right decision, we are sad to see the end of such a fantastic program. Before we say goodbye to the project, we do want to celebrate all of our families, volunteers, donors, and everyone who contributed to the last 31 years of Ulster Project Arlington. We are in the process of planning a closing ecumenical and celebration party on **JULY 10 - SAVE THE DATE!** More information to come very soon. Please plan to come and celebrate Ulster, reconnect with old friends, make new friends and have a great time.




