Saying "thank you" to God acknowledges God as the giver of grace, salvation, and all good and beautiful things.

So friends, lift your heads and hearts in an act of defiant gratitude this Thanksgiving. Put food in the Arlington Charities grocery basket, pack those NEW DAY bags, and make Shelter Sandwiches not out of despair but out of gratitude that we have enough to share, and that God is at work through our gifts.

#### The Six Great Ends of the Church

On Reformation Sunday, October 26, Pastor Kate preached the six great ends of the church, reflected in the beautiful banners hanging over the chancel. The Great Ends of the Church banners came to WPC from First Presbyterian Church in Grand Prairie which closed earlier this year. The banners were hand-made by a group of ladies at First Presbyterian Church headed by the late Suzanne Maas, and included Diana Stewart, Ann Siden, and Susan Reinarz. Suzanne's husband John Maas and her daughter-in-law Rena Maas are frequent visitors at WPC.

These six banners proclaim the mission and ministry of our denomination and are at the heart of who the church is and what the church is called to do. These great ends of the church are the following:

- The proclamation of the gospel for the salvation of humankind
- The shelter, nature, and spiritual fellowship of the children of God
- The maintenance of divine worship
- The preservation of the truth
- The promotion of social righteousness
- The exhibition of the Kingdom of Heaven to the world

At WPC, the banners will hang in the sanctuary of until the middle of November when they will be moved to Fellowship Hall in time for the All-Church Christmas Party on December 14. At that time, you will be able to see them up close.

This class reads and discusses various inspiring, insightful and challenging pieces of literature, which present moral questions and explore what it means to live a faithful life.





# Living Waters for the World Update: The Time Has Arrived!

WPC and our partner, Grace PC, Temple, TX (GPCT) will be traveling to Guatemala the week of November 9-16 for the planned installation of a clean water system at the Las Canoas school in San Andrès, Solola, Guatemala. See photos below of the school! Our team members are Catherine Fritz, Matt Baltensperger, and Harry Staley. Catherine's role is educating the school team members on the importance and benefits of clean water. Matt will be teaching the school system operators how to install and successfully operate the system. Both Catherine and Matt will have partners from the GPCT team. Harry's role is planning and organizing the joint efforts of the school staff and LWW team from here in Texas.

The water source the school is now using comes from the village and is not safe. The cooks in the cafeteria build wood fires under black kettles in the yard to boil the water for the students. Our plan is to alleviate this problem.

Upon completion, the costs of the system materials, labor costs for the in-country LWW staff, in country transportation, plus any additional system related costs, will be shared equally by WPC and GPCT. All personal costs (lodging, meals, airfare, etc.) will be provided by their church. Fortunately, WPC has adequate funds in the LWW account to cover our costs. When the team returns from the trip, they will be providing the congregation will detailed reports about the event.

Your WPC LWW team appreciates the continued support of everyone. It is a very meaningful mission for those we provide safe/healthy water for an area where all they have is unclean water and subsequent lingering health issues.

# Adopt-A-Project... the WPC Yard crew needs YOU!

These are small things, often needing only occasional attention throughout the season, but would help reduce the workload of the regular yard crew.

<u>Adopt-A-Hedge</u>: Front of the church. Everyone sees it. Shows We Care. Only needs

trimming twice a year. Tools provided.

Adopt-A-Parking Lot: Everyone uses it. Shows We Care. Spray weed killer along the

edges (provided) & pull weeds as needed. Usually 4 times a year.

Adopt-A-Sidewalk: Safety First! Shows We Care. This tree drops acorns in the Fall. Usually 4 weeks. We have a blower, broom, shovel, & trash can. Last week it took about 45 mins to clear the sidewalk and parking spaces under the tree. I did it before Sunday

school.

<u>Adopt-A-Playground:</u> Pick up sticks, blow the leaves into the yard, pull the occasional seedling the squirrels bury. Spray for wasps. Keeps our kids safe. Shows We Care.

<u>Adopt-A-Fence:</u> The pull of the old West calling? Get on your stick horse (not provided) and ride the backyard fence line. Weed maintenance along the fence line via weed killer (provided.) Saves loads of time for the crews. Looks great & Shows We Care.

# WPC Annual Presbyterian Children's Homes & Services Toy Drive



Did you know the PCHAS Toy Drive started 21 years ago with one church and one bank? Since then hundreds of young people in foster care have been helped.

The Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services (PCHAS) provides assistance to children and their families at two locations in North Texas (Waxahachie and Itasca) which serves children in foster care and single parent families. Along with the PCHAS homes, the annual children's toy drive includes a similar home in Denton.

The collection is not only conducted at our church, but also at over a dozen business locations in the Arlington and Pantego area. Each year, it grows just a little bit more! The children who receive these gifts are sometimes forgotten because of family conflicts or societal oversight.

This year again we will have a Christmas tree for these children. Help us fill it up with age-appropriate toys and Christmas gifts for children ages 1 to 17. Please keep these children in mind as you shop for the holidays. Please place the **unwrapped** gifts under the tree in Bullock Hall between November 15 - December 15.

Gift ideas include games, sports equipment, reading materials, necklaces and earrings, and anything that could be theirs alone! A Fever in the Heartland:

The Ku Klux Klan's Plan to Take over America and the Woman Who Stopped Them by Timothy Egan

This compelling and sometimes disturbing non-fiction book covers the Klan's growing power in the Midwest during the 1920s. The tragic death of Madge Oberholtzer, a Klan victim, and the subsequent trial curtailed the Klan plan to take over local, state, and the national government.

In December we will be discussing *The Marriage Portrait* by Maggie O'Farrell. This historical fiction novel tells the fictionalized story of Lucrezia de' Medici who was forced into marriage with the Duke of Ferrara. The book explores her life from childhood to her marriage and her fear that she will be killed if she doesn't produce an heir. The book is inspired by a real portrait of Lucrezia and the mystery surrounding her sudden death. It is a story of survival, power, and the constraints placed on women in 16th century Italy.
