Renewed Grace is a Presbytery-wide initiative focused on creating more inclusive worship practices for neurodivergent children—kids with autism, ADHD, and other beautifully diverse ways of thinking and experiencing the world. Not only will we receive grant funding through this cohort, but we'll also be learning and leading in best practices for inclusive worship. And here's the amazing part: when worship becomes more accessible for neurodiverse people, it becomes richer and more welcoming for everyone. By focusing on this particular need, the church in general will have more meaningful worship.

Rev. Miranda is our Renewed Grace Implementation Team leader, and the rest of the team includes Tia Chisi, Lee McGee, and Kathy Patterson. Each of the team members brings valuable experience working with neurodivergent children, as well as experience in leading and worshipping at WPC. Adult Two - Reading Disciples


This class reads and discusses various inspiring, insightful and challenging pieces of literature, which present moral questions and explore what it means to live a faithful life.



Scriptures: Luke 10:38-42


Main Idea: Mary's story teaches us that spending time listening to and learning from

Quilters Stitch Love and Hope

WPC Quilters meet on the 2nd Monday of each month from 9:00 a.m. until about noon in Fellowship Hall to work on quilts for the Salvation Army Life Shelter. We pin and tie quilts at each meeting. In December all the quilts made during the year will be donated to the organization and they will distribute them as their clients graduate from the program. We use embroidery floss to tie the quilts, so bring a needle and thimble and come join us!

Other ways you can help: Do you sew? Take home a "kit" and sew the squares together. We have 9 ½" squares matched up and ready to sew together. We need NEW cotton fabric in 5 yard pieces to make backings for the quilts. We also need NEW full size cotton TOP sheets for backings also, but they are harder to sew through by hand. Please do NOT bring used fabric or old sheets; they don't work well for our projects.

Do you work during the day but would like to help? We would like to form a group to meet one evening a month to work on quilts. **Join us for lunch after church on Sunday, October 19** to answer questions and to talk about an evening each month that works best for everyone.

"I can help with that!"

When I started coming to Westminster almost seven years ago, one of the first things I noticed when I arrived at church were the weeds in the corner of the parking lot. They were around two feet tall and I thought, "I can help with that!" On the west side of Fellowship Hall, there were two large piles of dead limbs. I was told they just hadn't been hauled to the dumpster. I thought, "I can help with that!"

I joined WPC (& the yard crew) and was assigned to a "big crew" (3 volunteers). There were only two mowers: the riding mower and the push mower, run by the two more senior members of the crew. No weed eater, no blower back then, only a temperamental gas edger which the push mower guy ran. I wondered, "How can I help?" The riding mower was gassed up and off he went! I helped by picking up trash before it got pureed into tiny pieces & sticks that wore down the mower blades.

The tall weeds in the parking lot are gone as are the old piles of dead limbs. My mentors have retired, and I'm the one who gets to choose which way the lines go when I mow. The church now has a weed eater, a blower, a chainsaw, and yes, the gas edger is still grinding along. Our grounds are maintained by volunteers: each month, one "big crew" (3 people), 1/2 of a "small crew" (1 of 2 people), and one person that fills in the rest of the time until we get more volunteers asking "How can I help with that?"

WPC and our partner, Grace PC, Temple, TX (GPCT) will be traveling to Guatemala the week of November 9-16 for the planned installation of a clean water system at the Los Canoas school in San Andrès, Solola, Guatemala. Our team members are Catherine Fritz, Matt Baltensperger and Harry Staley. Catherine's role is educating the school team members on the importance and benefits of clean water. Matt will be teaching the school system operators how to install and successfully operate the system. Both Catherine and Matt will have partners from the GPCT team. Harry's role is planning and organizing the joint efforts of the school staff and LWW team from here in Texas.

The water source the school is now using comes from the village and is not safe. The cooks in the cafeteria build wood fires under black kettles in the yard to boil the water for the students. Our plan is to alleviate this problem.

Upon completion, the costs of the system materials, labor costs for the in-country LWW staff, in country transportation, plus any additional system related costs, will be shared equally by WPC and GPCT. All personal costs (lodging, meals, airfare, etc.) will be provided by their church. We are in the process of providing a "proposed" budget for the WPC Mission team. Fortunately, WPC has adequate funds in the LWW account to cover our costs. When the team returns from the trip, they will be providing the congregation will detailed reports about the event.

Your WPC LWW team appreciates the continued support of everyone. We feel it is a very meaningful mission for those we provide safe/healthy water for an area where all they have is unclean water and subsequent lingering health issues.

Financial Report as of August 31, 2025



We are happy to report that we finished August with a positive balance and still have a positive outlook going forward. As we continue to look back over the last eight months, we have been able to accomplish so much. We continue to look for ways to help our church community as well as the Arlington community, the Texas community and beyond. We were a sponsor of the Guns to Gardens initiative, donating \$4,000 to turn unwanted firearms into gardening tools. The Mission Committee voted to support NEW DAY, Arlington Charities, Arlington Life Shelter, and Presbyterian Children's Home and Services (PCHAS) on September 18 for North Texas Giving Day. The WPC Quilting group is hard at work making quilts to support the Salvation Army Life Center - be sure to join us for lunch on October 19 to learn more about the Quilters' efforts!

All of these things would not be possible without your support. Let's continue to support WPC and each other as we head into the last quarter of 2025.

Peace & Global Witness Offering
October 5



On World Communion Sunday, we celebrate that Christ's peace extends throughout all creation. Whenever the church gathers for worship, we are assured of Christ's peace. We celebrate that we are connected, we are loved and we are not alone. We worship together and are fed from Scripture and at Christ's table of peace. Extending the peace of Christ is part of an active, engaged faith—a witness to what it means for us to be the Church, together. Through participation in the Peace & Global Witness Offering, WPC is extending Christ's peace throughout our community and our world.

Paul tells the church in Rome to pursue what makes for peace, build each other up, and to not cast judgment on those who are different from us or have different customs or needs for our own (Romans 14). Paul invites the Romans - and us - to break down the neat and orderly worlds we create for ourselves and experience the fullness of our diversity. This means leaving our comfort zones and seeing our neighbors, both around the corner and around the world, not as "them" but as "us," friends and siblings in Christ. Whenever we welcome and embrace one another in this way, we response to Paul's invitation to pursue what makes for peace.

A gift to the Peace & Global Witness Offering enables the church to pursue peace in a variety of ways. WPC retains 25% of this Offering for our own peacemaking efforts. Mid-councils retain an additional 25% for ministries of peace and reconciliation. The remaining 50% is used by the Presbyterian Mission Agency to advocate for peace and justice in cultures of violence, including our own, through collaborative projects of education and Christian witness. All our gifts together can make a meaningful impact, so please give generously on October 5!


