Plug in as a Sunday School teacher, or Mobile Food Pantry worker, or Guns to Gardens volunteer. For Christ is making all things new - including us, including Westminster, including Arlington - transforming us to look more and more like God's kingdom. And that means that it is never too late to make a new start.






Choir Rehearsal

Adult Two - Reading Disciples


This class reads and discusses various inspiring, insightful and challenging pieces of literature, which present moral questions and explore what it means to live a faithful life.

Lesson One: Mary Magdalene, the Tower **Scriptures:** John 20:11-18, John 11:17-27


Main Idea: Our faith is strengthened by learning more about Mary Magdalene, a

Financial Report as of July 31, 2025



I am happy to report that we finished July with a positive balance and a positive outlook going forward. As we look back over the first seven months of 2025, we have been able to accomplish much more that we had originally planned for. Early in the year, Session determined that we were in strong enough financial position to finish off our pledge to the Camp Gilmont Capital Campaign with a \$10,000 payment, nearly two years early. This fulfillment of our pledge allowed Camp Gilmont to expedite their planning and construction. Many of our youth and adults have spent a week or two at Camp Gilmont and have fond memories there.

Also, we sent \$5,000 to Grace Presbytery to reinforce that we are a part of the connectional church and what we gain from that relationship.

Also to your donations for the Presbytery Disaster Assistance program to help recover from the devastating floods in south Texas early this year, the Session voted to send \$10,000 to PDA to use as needed to help our neighbors there. Luckily, Mo-Ranch was spared significant damage, but their neighbors and friends were not as fortunate.

We continue to look for opportunities both within the church facilities (have you seen the playground lately?) and for opportunities in our neighborhood. This would not be possible without your support. For that, we THANK YOU.

Peace & Global Witness Offering Sunday, October 5



On World Communion Sunday on October 5, we celebrate that Christ's peace extends throughout all creation. Whenever the church gathers for worship, we are assured of Christ's peace. We celebrate that we are connected, we are loved and we are not alone. We worship together and are fed from Scripture and at Christ's table of peace. Extending the peace of Christ is part of an active, engaged faith—a witness to what it means for us to be the Church, together. Through participation in the Peace & Global Witness Offering, WPC is extending Christ's peace throughout our community and our world.

Paul tells the church in Rome to pursue what makes for peace, build each other up, and to not cast judgment on those who are different from us or have different customs or needs for our own (Romans 14). Paul invites the Romans - and us - to break down the neat and orderly worlds we create for ourselves and experience the fullness of our diversity. This means leaving our comfort zones and seeing our neighbors, both around the corner and around the world, not as "them" but as "us," friends and siblings in Christ. Whenever we welcome and embrace one another in this way, we response to Paul's invitation to pursue what makes for peace.

A gift to the Peace & Global Witness Offering enables the church to pursue peace in a variety of ways. WPC retains 25% of this Offering for our own peacemaking efforts. Mid-councils retain an additional 25% for ministries of peace and reconciliation. The remaining 50% is used by the Presbyterian Mission Agency to advocate for peace and justice in cultures of violence, including our own, through collaborative projects of education and Christian witness. All our gifts together can make a meaningful impact, so please give generously on October 5!


