Dear saints,

As I write this, we are in the midst of Vacation Bible School excitement! We had 36 kids attend and 15 youth join in leadership roles. Everyone has had a chance to learn that God is a real, loving, trustworthy friend for everyone! Our VBS leaders put that in practice in an additional way this year, with the creation of a "Yacht Club" for parents and caretakers. While their children were playing and learning, the Yacht Club was a place for parents to relax, recharge, and get to know each other. There were special "shark-cuterie" treats and phone charging stations. It was like we opened up this blank space for people so they could learn more about WPC and see that their family fits with us.

In our over-connected world, it seems like there's endless opportunity to belong. The latest issue *Presbyterian Outlook* even remarked upon the "epidemic of loneliness." Creating these spaces of hospitality in our midst is more important than ever: inviting someone to sit with you at lunch, inviting a neighbor to Sunday School, making room for the teenagers on your pew on Sunday. These are small but powerful ways to show the truth we live out: that we belong to Jesus Christ. The Heidelberg Catechism - a Q&A tool to teach Reformed faith - opens with this question: "What is your only comfort in life and in death? That I am not my own, but belong—body and soul, in life and in death—to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ."

We may be a smaller church, but that just means it's easier to tell people: you belong with me, you belong to God, you belong at WPC. Let us continue to share the Living Water with all those who are so thirsty for belonging.



Financial Report as of May 31, 2025



As we enjoy spring for as long as we can before hitting the hot days of summer, I am pleased to report that as of the end of May, we are in excellent financial position. Donations received toward your 2025 pledges exceeds \$136,000, which is well ahead of normal. Our expenses for the same period are \$130,136.

We know summer months are times when attendance is lower due to summer vacations, mission trips, and other travels; so history tells us donations will be down a little. History also tells us that Fall picks up again and the months of November and December generally are the highest giving months of the year.

You have also been especially generous to support our youth as they travel to Tulsa on their summer mission trip. We have heard past stories of what they saw during those trips and how it has impacted their lives. Thank you for your support as we reach out through our youth to help others in need.

Thank you **Earlene Pike**, **April Poitras**, **and Nikki Thompson** for representing WPC on the Board of Directors.



In **July** we're reading *The Exiles* by Jane Harper. Ms. Harper is an Australian author, and this book is part of a trilogy featuring detective Aaron Falk. While attending a festival, a young mother disappears leaving her six week old daughter alone in a stroller. This case is never solved. A year later, Falk is persuaded to look into the disappearance. In the background of this, a six year old fatal hit and run case, also unsolved, seems to have a connection to the missing mother. Can Detective Falk find the link and solve both crimes?

Our **August** selection is *The Frozen River* by Ariel Lawhon. This story, set in 18th century Maine, is based on the true story of a pioneering midwife, Martha Ballard. Martha keeps a detailed diary of all of her cases so she knows what goes on behind closed doors. When a body is found in a frozen river, Martha believes the victim is actually a man who committed an assault months before. As the situation unfolds, Martha's diary becomes part of the unfolding scandal, and she is forced to decide where her loyalties lie.



- 4. No Session meeting in June; we will meet again on July 27.






