No matter how far we wander, may we know that God is using grace like a fetter to bind us together. No matter how often we get it right or how often we get it wrong, God loves us the same. Let us rest in that Easter joy and hope - that He is risen! He is risen indeed.

GOOD NEWS!

Your Living Waters for the World team is going to get busy. We along with Grace Presbyterian Church, Temple, TX, (GPCT) are planning on joining forces to install a new system at the Las Canoas Elementary School in the Lake Atitlan area of Guatemala. We had such success by partnering with FPC Richmond, VA. in Nicaragua, we felt it was important to join with another church to share labor and costs. FPC has had to drop out of the LWW program and Nicaragua is no longer a safe place to travel. GPCT has installed several systems in Nicaragua and Guatemala in the past. We are joining forces with a veteran team. As of today, we have Catherine Fritz and Matt Baltensperger scheduled to represent WPC on this trip.

The in-country LWW staff has completed a "site assessment" of the location, community support, school staff and water & electric supplies. It is their recommendation; this is a viable location for a new system.

We are in the process of obtaining approval of the project from LWW headquarters staff. Upon approval we will begin the process of preparing a joint covenant with the school to outline responsibilities of all parties involved. We are currently considering the need to make an initial (short three day) trip to Guatemala to meet with the school principal, teachers and community leaders to review the process, and get support from all of them to move forward with the project.

Upon approval and signing the covenant we will begin the process of purchasing the system, making arrangements for delivery to Guatemala, working with the in-country LWW staff, determining the date for installation and outlining the responsibilities for everyone. The school is responsible for having a secure building for the system, a dependable water supply, and electricity source. It is also their responsibility to provide staff to operate the system and have a water committee to support and promote the use of water in their community. As of today, there is no definite date scheduled for an installation.

Your WPC LWW team appreciates the continued support of everyone. We feel it is a very meaningful mission for those we provide safe/healthy water for an area where all they have is unclean water and subsequent lingering health issues.






Flower Bed in Progress



Spring Reminders!

Glorifying God is the center of Westminster Presbyterian Church. Many things make up our worship service so that all can worship God. Please consider the following:

- **Lord, prepare me**: When coming into the sanctuary, please use the time to prepare for worship by sitting quietly, meditating, and preparing your mind and body for worship. There will be time to visit after the service in Bullock Hall.
- **Meet in the middle:** Please leave the ends of the pews available for late comers, so that they can easily find a seat.
- **Be right back:** Try to tend to personal needs before the service, so that there is less disruption with folks going in and out of the sanctuary during worship. Those with special needs may consider sitting on the outside of the pews in order to get out easily.
- **Reading Rainbow:** For our younger worshippers, stop by the bookcase on your way into worship, and pick out something to read and enhance your faith in worship!
- **Pass it on:** When the offering is collected, please pass the plate down the pew to the other end. By everyone doing this, the procedure goes smoother and helps the ushers do their job.
- **Amen!** Please remember that the choir sings to glorify God and to enhance the scripture and the message. The choir is not performing for the congregation. While calling "Amen" is appropriate, please reconsider clapping.
- **Clean up, clean up**: In worship and any other activities at church, please pick up around you as you leave! Turn out lights behind you, pick up trash, and leave it better than you found it.
