Financial Report - as of November 30, 2024

As we celebrate the coming of the Christ child, let us stop to appreciate what we have been able to accomplish this year because of your belief in and support of the many ministries of Westminster. We are entering the last month of the year in an excellent financial position and have accomplished much, but there is more that could be done.

If we gave you a list of WPC missions and you were asked to prioritize them, I'm sure every list would be different. For example, on December 8, we had the blessing of the quilts. If you were a member of the dedicated quilters, I'd bet that would be number 1 on your list. If you among those who pack or deliver NEW DAY supplies to our schools, that would be high on your list. If you worked with the youth or taught Sunday School, that would be high on your list.

Right now, the Session is putting together the 2025 Proposed Budget which will be presented to you after the first of the year. You will be asked to fill out a pledge card indicating your level of financial support for the coming year. From that, the Session will finalize a 2025 budget to work within.

Did you know that approximately 25% of our giving units (donors like you and me) do not turn in a pledge card? They will give faithfully during the year, but are uncomfortable committing because they are not sure what the coming year has in store for them personally. I have been on the Finance Committee for about 35 years and treasurer for about 20 years and we have never compared individual pledges to donations.

To estimate those missing pledges, we build in a "faith factor" to allow us to finalize the budget. And that helps drive what ministries we prioritize during the year. We ask that you begin thinking about what you can do, whether through physical labor on work days, or prayer, or financially to support the ministries of WPC in 2025.


