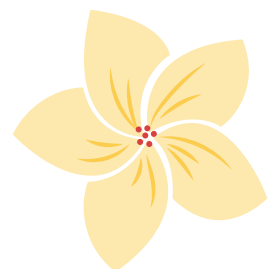

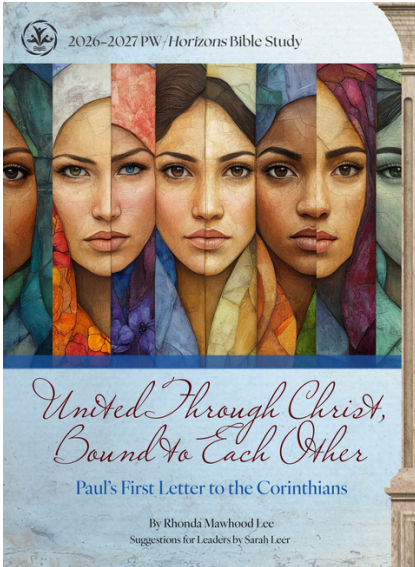

It's hard to believe we are at the end of the school year and SUMMER is upon us. Did you know that each month WPC sends generous donations to Arlington Charities, NEW DAY and Presbyterian Children's Homes & Services (PCHAS)? We also send donations to Grace Presbytery to go towards disaster assistance. The money that we send each month is not from WPC, it is from individual members who add dollars to their giving each month and earmark it for these individual charities. During Lent/Easter we took a special Presbyterian offering for One Great Hour of Sharing. Members of WPC were very generous with that as well. There will be two additional special Presbyterian offerings during the year. One is the Peace and Global Witness Offering (World Communion Sunday) and one is the Christmas Joy Offering (Advent/Christmas). It is so wonderful to continue to see the people of WPC show that we are Where People Care.

Westminster has just completed its eleventh school year as a NEW DAY site, one of five Arlington churches that deliver weekend meals to food-insecure students. The eight-item bags are packed and delivered each week by 33 faithful volunteers, most of whom have worked with NEW DAY for many years. In addition, there have been groups from St. Andrews UMC, Greater Missionary Baptist Church, Arlington Women's Club, the Boy and Girl Scouts and our own Youth Group who have helped out from time to time. During the 2025-26 school year, the WPC site packed a total of 8948 bags, delivered to 11 different schools. Volunteers also order, pick up and shelve food, liaise with the AISD, and serve on the Board of Directors. The congregation participates through their gifts of money, groceries during food drives and prayers. A big THANK YOU to all!

So where is your neighborhood? Is it your subdivision, your zip code, your city, your region, your state, or is it bigger than that and it actually encompasses the entire globe? As the Artemis II astronauts remarked, as they looked down at Earth from their spaceship, we are all on a spaceship hurtling through space. And it is up to us to keep our ship in good condition and sustainable, not just for us but all the generations to come. Right now with all the rain we are getting lately, it is hard to believe but 63% of the United States is living in drought conditions. Water is not an infinite resource. We cannot make it rain at will.

As we transition from spring into summer, many of our thoughts will be turning to how we can keep our grass, plants, bushes, and trees alive as the weather gets hotter and drier. Is there anything we can do to help preserve our precious water droplets and our gardens and lawns as well? One way is to pay attention to and actually try some of the suggestions that are already being aired as Public Service Announcements about water conservation. We can water less frequently but more thoroughly. We can water at optimum times of the day to do the most good and prevent unnecessary evaporation. Our new WPC container prayer garden is focusing on the use of native plants that function well in our climate. The WPC grounds are already full of native plants that provide beauty as well as a habitat for bees and butterflies. The Earth Care Committee is encouraging donations for the prayer garden to function in the same way through the use of even more native plants. And guess what? They function equally well in neighborhood yards as well.

So let's begin to think about our water resources and how to best use them. Let's make not just our local neighborhood but our global neighborhood as well a better place to live by doing our small part for sustainability.

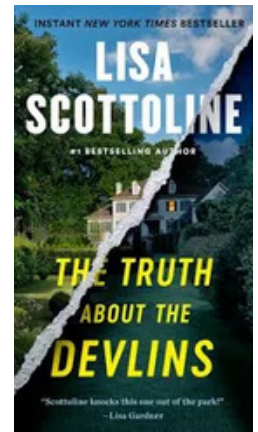

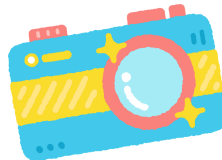
WPC Young Adults

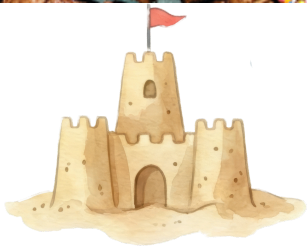

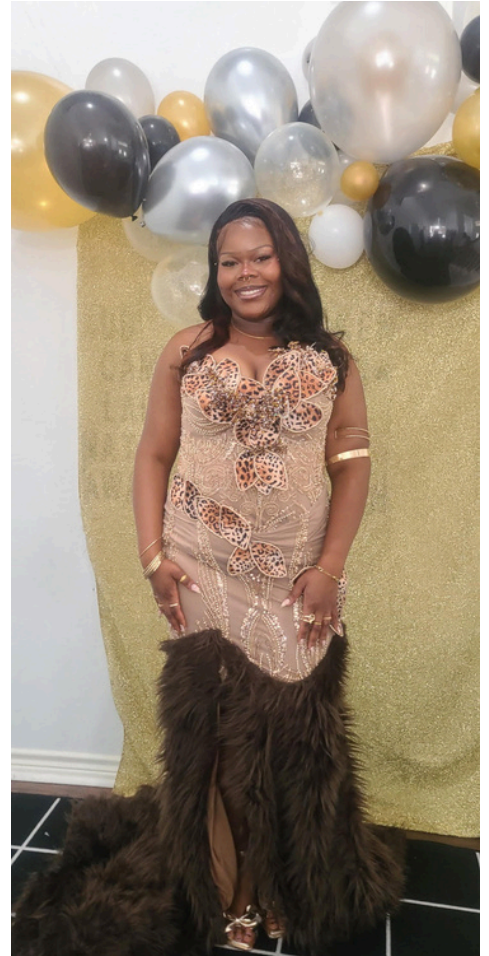
