

This class reads and discusses various inspiring, insightful and challenging pieces of literature, which present moral questions and explore what it means to live a faithful life.







- Work to update and improve our Sanctuary garden area continues with plans to add a new sun shade, planters with native, drought-tolerant varieties, and some thoughtful decorative items in the space. If you're interested in helping in this project, please contact Rae Logan.
- The ECC committee will host our last Crucial Conversations dinner on March 25, featuring a taco bar. If you're interested in helping with this one-night commitment, please contact Catherine Fritz.
- The ECC committee will share a week of Mindful Moments shared through the church daily updates and/or Facebook during the week leading up to Earth Day on April 22. You'll hear brief 1-2 minute shares from Session elders in how our earth care initiative has impacted their ministry, as well as prayers and meditative moments from several committee members.
- Come join our celebration of the Sanctuary Garden Dedication on the Sunday following Earth Day, April 26. We will share our renovations and where to access some meditative materials as you enjoy our newly updated space.
- The ECC committee will host one evening of Vacation Bible School sharing some fun, exciting activities from both Living Waters of the World curriculum as well as an activity showing our young people how to make their own paper from recycled materials. 
Bookworms

The March reading selection is *Switchboard Soldiers* by Jennifer Chiaverini. Based on a real life story, this novel details the work of a group of women switchboard operators in France during World War I. This was an unusual job for women in wartime but they were found to be more efficient than the men when it came to transmitting information. The author details their training, deployment, and challenges as they assumed a man's role in a war setting. Our Bookworms group is constantly amazed at all of the untold stories about courageous women that we have discovered.

The April selection is *Maisie Dobbs* by Jacqueline Winspear. Also set during World War I, Maisie is a young maid in a large household who is given the rare opportunities to not only receive an education but also to be mentored by a psychologist/investigator. She goes on to become a nurse during the war and then works with her mentor. This book explores the psychological impact of war, especially "shell shock", social class, and the changing role of women. This is book one of an eighteen book series that continues the various cases upon which Maisie works.




