Dear saints,

He is risen! He is risen indeed. That's right, we are still in the season of Easter - the great 50 days. Our worship has been full of special Sundays in order to celebrate this special season: Youth Sunday, Festival of Hymns, and Creation Care Sunday. Still to come include Renewed Grace Sunday, Confirmation Sunday, Ascension Sunday, and Pentecost! It's a wonderful reminder that every Sunday is special because we get to worship our risen Lord, because He has made redemption possible, because we get to experience grace and mercy every day.

Recently, the *Presbyterian Outlook* featured a [column](#) from Rev. Dr. Jen Bluestein, Grace Presbytery's Generational Leadership Development Coordinator and the project director for Renewed Grace. She writes of the challenges that many neurodivergent people in church encounter: "For neurodivergent children and their parents, attitudinal barriers may look or feel like judgment of parenting practices when some congregants - or even the parents themselves - indicate that the children are distracting when they are not sitting still or are being too noisy. These beliefs often result from what a person was taught as a child about 'appropriate' behavior in church. When we embrace neurodiversity, however, we begin to examine these unwritten rules to ask: Are they true? Does this belief reflect how God calls us to be in community, or is it an arbitrary expectation that we have designed?...Jesus cared deeply about those excluded from the community and criticized those who upheld rules that kept them out." I am so grateful that at WPC, we have never let arbitrary expectations limit the movement of the Spirit in our midst. Whether it's paving a smooth entrance under the portico, providing pew cuts for strollers and wheelchairs, plugging in a cochlear implant device, or simply adding the words to the anthem on the screen, we are continuing to find ways to share the Living Water with all who thirst. Thank you for your continued work at inclusion!

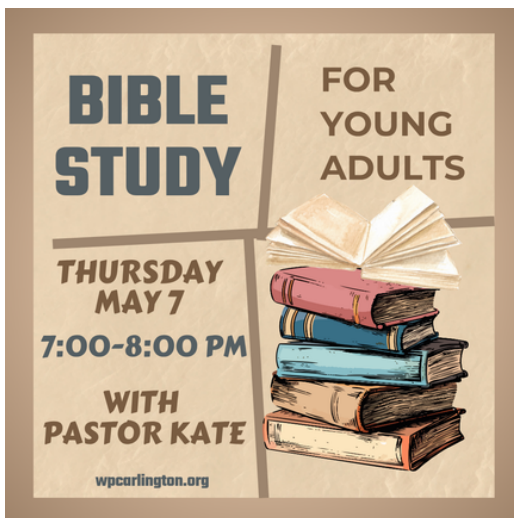

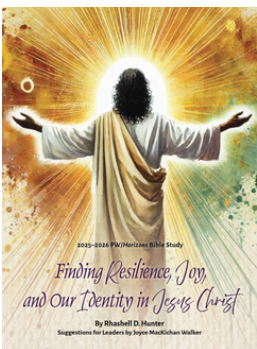

A 1-Day Virtual Course presented by Texas Health Community Hope

WHY MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID?

Mental Health First Aid is a skills-based training course that teaches you to identify, understand and respond to signs of mental health and substance use challenges among adults. Just as CPR helps you assist an individual having a heart attack, Mental Health First Aid helps you assist someone in crisis.

WHO NEEDS TO KNOW MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID

The program is designed for adults who want to learn how to help people who may be experiencing a mental health-related crisis or problem. No prior training or experience is required. Mental Health First Aid is a particularly valuable tool for employers, hospital personnel, first responders, educators, counselors and clergy.

WHAT'S INVOLVED

There is no cost to participate in Mental Health First Aid training. However, space is limited and pre-registration is required. All sessions are conducted online via ZOOM or Teams. Participants must complete 2 hours of online prework (on your own) in advance of the course. The course itself lasts approximately 5.5 hours, including all breaks.

WHAT IT COVERS

- Common signs and symptoms of mental health and substance use challenges.
- How to interact with a person in crisis.
- How to interact with a person in crisis and connect them with help

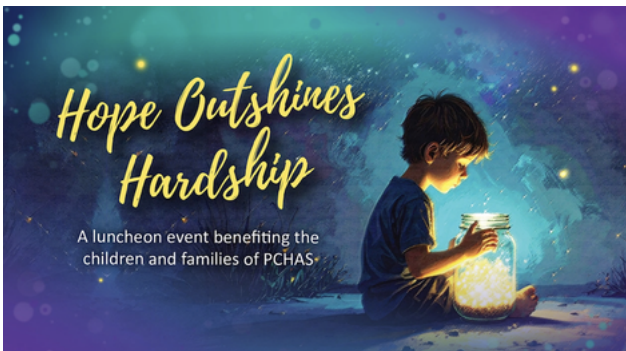

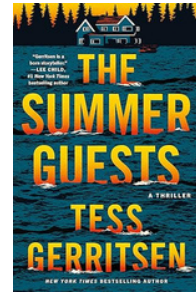

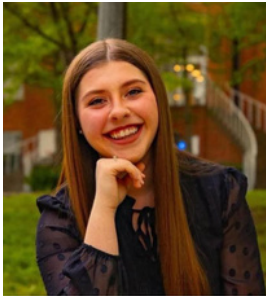

The Guitar Studio Foundation (TGSF) is a Fort Worth-based 501(c)(3) nonprofit dedicated to expanding access to high-quality music education through classical guitar. Building on more than 40 years of community impact through The Guitar Studio, the Foundation focuses on outreach, education, and meaningful connection through music.

TGSF works to remove financial barriers by providing scholarships for students who would not otherwise have access to private instruction, and by partnering with schools and community programs to bring instruments and educational resources directly to young musicians. Through collaborations with organizations and international partners such as Altamira Guitars, the Foundation has helped place quality classical guitars into the hands of students both locally and abroad, supporting developing programs and underserved communities.

In addition to its educational initiatives, TGSF presents concerts, workshops, and community events that bring people together and highlight the expressive power of the classical guitar. These performances often serve a dual purpose: enriching the cultural life of the community while raising support for ongoing outreach efforts.

At its core, The Guitar Studio Foundation believes that music is a powerful tool for connection, education, and opportunity, and is committed to ensuring that students of all backgrounds have the chance to experience it.

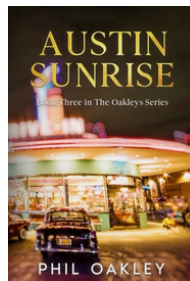
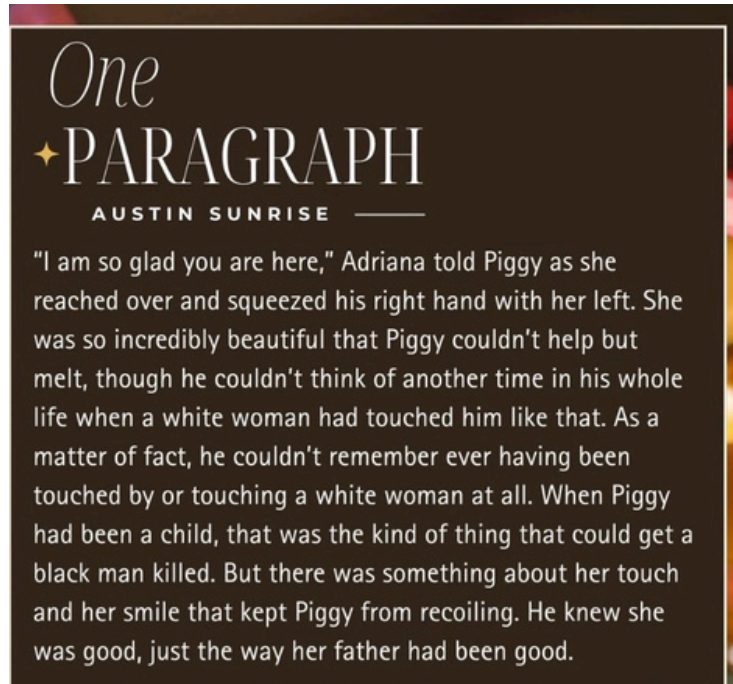
